The New Roman Missal

There is a new English edition of the Roman Missal to be used at Mass beginning the First Sunday of Advent (**November 27, 2011**).

While the parts of the Mass will not change, some prayers of the Mass have been revised with a new English translation. This edition updates the Missal with the Masses for the many new saints and blessed which were named during the pontificate of Pope John Paul II. It also adds several texts for Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary, as well as Masses for various needs.

The new translation will match more closely the Latin text, which draws on the richness of Sacred Scripture, as well as on other prayers from the Church's tradition. The language has been described as more elevated, poetic, and humble in style.

The Holy See granted the final approval of the text in the spring of 2010. Cardinal Francis George, OMI, president of the USCCB, announced that parishes may begin using the revised translation on November 27, 2011. New musical settings of the Glory to God, Holy, and Memorial Acclamation may be introduced as early as September.

- ❖ **The Rule of St. Benedict** The way of life as set down by St. Benedict in his Rule offers each of us Christian ideals that, while challenging, are flexible, adaptable and moderate so that no one need be dismayed or discouraged while “seeking God.” Oblates of St. Benedict are lay Christians, men and women, single or married, who seek a deeper spiritual relationship by sharing in the prayer and good works of a monastic community.
